GUIDELINES FOR SUPERVISORS

Deal with players - NOT PARENTS.

Wear some type of identification.

Appoint a deputy if leaving courts.

Always be available. Let people know where you are.

Receive and consider information and views from others, but always make your own decision.

Be seen regularly around courts.

When no umpires, players must accept opponent/s decision. When an argument develops, you can be called to the court for:

- a) disputed decision on the rules**
- b) score disagreement.**

Things to watch for:

Outside interference, spectators, parents, coaching.

Use commonsense in dealing with situations and decisions, have ability to communicate, be even tempered, patient and in control. Be positive, exercise consistency.

Have a thorough knowledge of rules, have Godlike weather forecasting ability.

Be approachable and communicate with players in a calm, adult fashion.

“RESPECT the OFFICIAL”

Officials are volunteers who do it for the love of the game.
Officials aren't perfect; they do make mistakes just like players.
Set a good example for your kids by respecting these volunteers.

We don't want to lose 'em so don't abuse 'em.

Our number of volunteers are diminishing every year so help us to keep them.

NORTH EAST TENNIS ASSOCIATION - JUNIOR MATCH RULES

1 REGISTRATION:

- a) A junior must be registered by submitting a registration form (in the form approved by the Junior Match Committee) to the score stewards prior to playing a match for an affiliated club, or by registering the player on the back of the score sheet.
- b) A club shall lose all sets played by an unregistered player 0-6.

2 TRANSFERS:

A junior shall not play for more than one affiliated club in the junior competition during the season without permission from the Junior Match Committee.

3 TEAMS:

- a) A junior shall be under the age of 18 years as at 1st April.
- b) There shall be 4 or 5 players in each team. Teams shall be all girls or all boys except in the bottom Association division of boys or girls where they can be mixed. (A club may apply to the score steward when there are exceptional circumstances for permission to vary these requirements.)
- c) Teams to be graded on ability, where there are two or more teams in a division they shall be of equal strength.
- d) In each team of 4 or 5 players the number 1 single player must play in the first double. If the number 1 single player does not play a doubles match then the number 2 singles player must play in the 1st double. Penalty: loss of 2nd double 6-0.

4 MATCHES:

- a) A match shall consist of 2 double and 4 single 6 game sets - Boys Div. A1- Div. 5 inc. - Girls Div. A1- Div. 3 inc. - with a tiebreak to be played at 5 games all. All other divisions will play a straight 6 game set.
- b) FRIDAY NIGHT players shall be present by 6:15pm to commence at 6.30pm and conclude no later than 9:00pm if using two courts per match, 9:30pm if using less than two courts per match. A team unable to commence a doubles set by 6:30pm shall forfeit the second double. If two courts are available a team unable to commence both doubles sets by 6:30pm shall forfeit any double that is unable to commence. A team unable to commence a singles match by 7pm shall forfeit the match.
SATURDAY MORNING matches shall commence at 9.00am and conclude no later than 12 noon. A team unable to commence doubles sets by 9:00am shall forfeit any double that is unable to commence. A team unable to commence a singles match by 9:30am shall forfeit the match.
- c) FRIDAY NIGHT any singles set not commenced by **8:00pm** if using two courts, **8:30pm** if using less than two courts shall be reduced to a straight 4 game set. (Players must be told before the match begins.)
SATURDAY MORNING any singles set not commenced by 11:30am shall be reduced to a straight 4 game set. (Players must be told before the set begins.)
- d) Players will be permitted to a hit-up of no more than 3 minutes prior to the commencement of each double and each single.

- e) All matches are to be conducted on a minimum of 1.5 courts per match.
- f) On completion of both doubles matches, all players shall remain within close proximity of the playing venue and shall make themselves available to play in any singles order or rotation as agreed by the captains of opposing teams. Any player not in attendance and prepared to play within 10 minutes of being required shall forfeit the match.

5 MATCH SCORE SHEETS:

- a) The match score sheet shall be filled in by the team captains before the match commences.
- b) At the conclusion of a match, the match score sheet shall be signed by both captains and a supervisor.
- c) Any team whose match result sheet is not received by the score steward by 7.00pm on the second working day following the match will lose all points earned the previous Saturday the second time this occurs and thereafter.

6 TENNIS BALLS:

FRIDAY NIGHT teams shall provide 2 new tennis balls for each match.

SATURDAY MORNING home teams shall provide 2 pair of good tennis balls. (ie. WITH SOME BRAND REMAINING) for each match

7 DRESS CODE:

Players must present themselves for play in clean and customarily acceptable tennis attire.

8 PREMIERSHIP POINTS:

- a) 4 premiership points shall be awarded to a winning team. In the case of a draw, 2 points shall be awarded to each team. Teams will also be awarded 1 point for each set won.
- b) A team receiving a forfeit shall be awarded 10 points, 6 sets, 36 games.

9 CODE OF CONDUCT:

CLUBS should make every effort to contact the other club involved to settle any reports of CODE OF CONDUCT violations, DISPUTES, MATCH RULES. If it cannot be resolved this way, a report, submitted only from a Club Official can be sent, in writing/email, to NETA Secretary / Manager within 48 hours after the day on which the alleged offence took place.

All correspondence to NETA Committee including but not limited to CODE OF CONDUCT REPORTS must be from a club official.

The only exception is the normal expected contact with the score stewards and Junior Competition Officer.

10 SUPERVISORS:

- a) FRIDAY NIGHT. Participating clubs shall be rostered to supervise the whole venue. The court supervisor shall have the powers of a referee when a referee is needed.
SATURDAY MORNING. Each club shall appoint an adult or responsible person to supervise each home match venue. The court supervisor shall have the powers of a referee when a referee is needed.
- b) If an umpire is appointed by the supervisor, they must not be a parent of any player involved in the set being umpired.

- c) Teams in the bottom association divisions of boys & girls must be supervised at both home & away matches by an adult who shall assist with umpiring.
- d) During the conduct of a match, only court supervisors and players shall be permitted inside the playing area.

11 FORFEITS:

- a) Clubs shall take all reasonable action to field complete teams and any club not fielding a complete team must provide a satisfactory explanation in writing to the score steward with the score sheets recording the forfeits. Clubs not providing a satisfactory explanation shall not receive any points for that match.
- b) FRIDAY: A team unable to commence a singles match by 7:00pm shall forfeit the set starting from the number 4 position upwards.
SATURDAY: A team unable to commence a singles match by 9:30am shall forfeit the set from the number 4 position upwards.
This means that each player in the forfeiting team shall move up a position / positions to take the place of the absent player leaving the number 4 position vacant to be forfeited.
- c) Teams forfeiting shall notify opposing teams at least 1 hour before the commencement of a match. Teams winning on forfeit shall submit a match score sheet as required in rule 5 to record premiership points and eligibility for finals.

12 INCLEMENT WEATHER & INCOMPLETE MATCHES:

- a) The Junior Match Committee WILL NOT CANCEL WINTER MATCHES except under EXTREME conditions. In the case of inclement weather, cancellation can only be found out by contacting your club delegate or the venue you are programmed to attend.
- b) All matches shall be played as scheduled unless cancelled in 12(a). TEAMS MUST REMAIN AT COURTS FOR AT LEAST HALF AN HOUR FROM 6:30PM on FRIDAY NIGHTS and 9.00AM on SATURDAY MORNINGS or WHEN WEATHER STOPPED PLAY BEFORE SUPERVISORS DECIDE IF UNSUITABLE TO PLAY.
- c) In the case of an unfinished match from any minor round a team will be awarded the win if it is in an unbeatable position. If a decision is not reached then each team will be awarded 2 points each plus one point for each set won.
- d) In the case of a CANCELLED match by a VENUE'S COURT SUPERVISOR, all rounds will be counted and points awarded as in Rule 12c). All teams must submit a score sheet.
- e) FRIDAY NIGHT & SATURDAY MORNING MATCHES. If rain (or any weather conditions, eg. heat) delays the start of play, court supervisors have the power to restrict matches to 4 game sets at their discretion.

13 INTERPRETATION:

The Junior Match Committee shall be responsible for the interpretation of these rules and where not already specified, the determination of penalties for breaches.

RULES OF THE TIE-BREAK SYSTEM - Refer Rule 4a)

SINGLES

- a) A player who first wins seven points shall win the game and the set provided he/she leads by a margin of two points. If the score reaches six points all, the game shall be extended until the margin has been achieved. Numerical scoring shall be used throughout the tie-break system.
- b) The player whose turn it is to serve shall be the server for the first point. His/her opponent shall be the server for the second and third points and thereafter each player shall serve alternately for two consecutive points until the winner of the game and set has been decided.
- c) From the first point, each service shall be delivered alternately from the right and left courts, beginning from the right court.
- d) Players shall change ends after every six (6) points.

DOUBLES

In doubles the procedure for singles shall apply. The player whose turn it is to serve shall be the server for the first point. Thereafter, each player shall serve in rotation for two points. In the same order as previously in that set, until the winners of the game and set have been decided.

TEAM WITHDRAWAL AFTER THE PROGRAMME HAS BEEN COMPLETED AND SENT TO THE PRINTER. A reminder that Clubs will still be responsible for the team nomination fee.

NORTH EAST TENNIS ASSOCIATION SELF UMPIRING

1 GENERAL

- a) It is the responsibility of a player to make calls on his/her side of the net, to help his/her opponent to make calls only when he/she requests it, and to call against him/herself (with the exception of the first service) any ball that he/she clearly sees out on his/her opponents side of the net.
- b) No player should question an opponent's call, but a player should always request his/her opponent's opinion when the opponent is in a better position to see the ball, once the opponent has given a positive opinion, it must be accepted. If neither player has an opinion, the ball is considered 'good'.
- c) Any ball that cannot be called 'out' is presumed 'good'. Do not ask your opponent to 'take two'.
- d) If one partner calls a ball 'out' and the other one calls 'good', the doubt that has been established means that the ball must be considered 'good'.
- e) Any call of 'out', 'net' or 'fault' must be made instantaneously and clearly otherwise the ball is presumed 'good' and still in play. 'Instantaneously' means that the call is made before either an opponent has hit the return or the return has gone out of play. Most importantly, the ball is not 'out' until called 'out'.
- f) If you call a ball 'out' then realise it was 'good', correct your decision.
- g) Unless there is a bad line marking, balls causing chalk to fly should be considered 'good'. Decide before the match if 'chalk flying' balls will be considered 'good'. Remember a ball landing on the line is considered to be IN.
- h) The ball must pass over the net before it may be volleyed. A player, his/her racquet or clothing cannot touch any part of the net whilst the ball is in play, but, if the ball has bounced on your

side of the net and blown back, you may lean over the net to hit it, providing once again that your racquet or any part of your body or clothing does not touch the net or your opponent's court whilst the ball is in play.

- i) Calls involving hitting an opponent's return before it has passed the net, and double bounce (not up) can be very difficult to make. A player who realises he/she has committed a violation in these areas should announce this immediately.
- j) A PLAYER LOSES THE POINT IF:
 - i) He/she catches the ball, or allows it to hit him/her or his/her clothing either inside or outside the court before it touches the ground.
 - ii) The ball hits his/her racquet either inside or outside of the court before touching the ground, unless he/she volleys the ball and makes a good return.

2 START OF PLAY:

The choice of ends and the right to be the server or receiver shall be decided by toss. The player winning the toss may choose or require his/her opponent to choose:

- a) the right to be the server or receiver, in which case the other player shall choose the end, **or**
- b) the end, in which case the other player shall choose the right to be the server or receiver.

3 SERVING:

The server calls the game score before starting to serve and the point score before serving each point.

- a) Foot faulting is cheating and the foot faulter should be warned.
- b) The server wins the point if the served ball (not being a let) touches the receiver or his/her racquet or anything he/she wears, or the receiver's partner, before hitting the ground.
- c) If a server serves out of turn, change as soon as the mistake is discovered, but all points scored are counted.
- d) Bounce serving (bouncing the ball and then hitting it) is not permissible. The ball must be struck with the racquet while in the air.

4 RECEIVING

- a) When returning service, the partner of the receiver should call the service, the partner of the receiver should call the service for him/her, with the receiver calling the centre and side service lines.
- b) If the player receiving the ball changes sides by mistake, he/she should return to his/her rightful position at the end of the game being played.

5 SCORING

- a) Players should agree upon the game score at the end of each game.
- b) In arguing the score, it should be remembered that each side has equal weight.
- c) The method of settling a score dispute is to go back to the last score on which there is agreement, then resume play from that point.

DO NOT ENLIST THE AID OF ANYONE NOT ENGAGED IN THE MATCH. SPECTATOR/PARENT INTERFERENCE IS NOT ACCEPTABLE IN ANY JUNIOR MATCH AND ESPECIALLY SO IN FINALS MATCHES. ALWAYS PRACTICE SPORTSMANSHIP - DO NOT STALL, SULK, COMPLAIN OR PRACTISE GAMESMANSHIP.

IN THE CASE OF DISPUTES: CALL THE SUPERVISOR WHO WILL ACT AS REFEREE.
